This is the first year that we have held a Year 5&6 event, and we were delighted that 4 schools took part in this

competition. The winners this year were Oldfield Primary School (Pictured bottom). In 2nd place was Mill View Primary School and in 3rd place was Saighton CE Primary School.

Year 5&6 Tri-Golf and Year 7-9 Inclusive Tri-Golf Competitions

On Wednesday 20th May Helsby Golf Club hosted the Year 5&6 Tri Golf and Year 7-9 Inclusive Tri-Golf Competitions. In total 14 school teams were in attendance at the event. Many of the children were new to Tri-Golf but picked up the skills quickly. The teams rotated around 7 different tri-golf stations which involved either putting or driving skills.

In the 'A' team event, Christleton Primary School (pictured top) won the competition with a high score of 951 points. In second place was Overleigh St Mary's CE Primary School with 507 points, and in third place

was Delamere CE Academy (pictured bottom) with 465 points.

Christleton Primary School will now represent Chester at the Cheshire and Warrington Summer School Games in July.

In the 'B' event, Saighton CE Primary School won with 450 points, in second place was Highfield Community Primary School with 447 points. In third place was Delamere CE Academy with 335 points.

In the Year 7-9 Inclusive competition, it was a close match with Dee Banks School beating Dorin Park School by 10 points to win with 151 points. Dee Banks School will also now represent Chester at the Cheshire and Warrington Summer School Games in July.

Well done to all the children for taking part in the event.

School Games Mark

The Sainsbury's School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. Schools in England are able to assess themselves across bronze, silver and gold levels of the Mark. All School Games registered schools are able to apply for the Mark.



The application window opens on Wednesday 3rd June and closes on Wednesday 30th September. Further information is available via the school dashboard, the customised content portal for all schools logged in to the website.

The supporting document which gives schools more detail on what evidence is required to support your application has now been released and is available on the School Games website. www.yourschoolgames.com

Why should our school apply?

- OfSTED use the Mark award as part of their inspection framework
- You can proudly display your certificate, pennant and plaque (Gold level only) at your school
- You can use it as a development tool to aid the PE teacher or Head teacher at your school
- You can add the logo to letterheads and email signatures to show your outstanding commitment to school sport.

There will be a workshop on Tuesday 16th June at Blacon High School from 3.30pm—4.30pm to help you to understand the criteria for the Mark Award and help you in the application process. Please book your place now.

New ECB On Line Resource

The England & Wales Cricket Board have launched the 2015 Ashes Schools Challenge – this free interactive resource is designed to support teachers delivering lessons in Key Stage 2 & 3 through the inspiring summer of cricket with England playing Australia in the 2015 Investec Ashes Series.

Building on the success of the 2013 Ashes School Challenge and 2014 India & Sri Lanka Schools Challenge, which engaged with more than 2,500 primary schools, the new Ashes Schools Challenge is fully integrated with the UK National Curriculum for Key Stages 2 and 3.

As part of the free interactive programme, teachers will be able to access 15 bespoke lesson plans and activities which will use the rich cricketing history of both countries to help develop literacy skills, numeracy skills and a wider understanding of historic rivalry between England and Australia.

Former England captain and ECB's Managing Director of Cricket Partnerships, Mike Gatting, said: "The inaugural Ashes Schools Challenge in 2013 resulted in a superb response from thousands of schools across the country, and the launch of the new online Schools Challenge today provides another exciting opportunity for even more schools to get involved with this innovative classroom initiative.

"Both England and Australia are nations with rich cricketing traditions. Learning how the Ashes are interwoven with the history and culture of both countries will be fascinating for pupils and is a great way for them to develop literacy and numeracy skills – and we trust – a passion for cricket itself."

Working in partnership with Chance to Shine and MCC, in addition to being available online for anyone to access, the Ashes Schools Challenge will be adopted as part of the Chance to Shine educational programme in thousands of state schools across the country this summer.

Change 4 Life: A Case Study.



Primary Change 4 Life Sports Club Saughall All Saints CE Primary School

The school did not receive a C4L equipment bag, but run a club which meets the aims of a C4L Club.

Day and time of the week: Tuesdays 3.15 – 4.15pm.

What theme does the C4L club have? – The club started in September 2014 as a Cheerleading Club for girls in KS2. From January 2015, the club has evolved to include a song and dance element to it.

Year Group of the children who attend the C4L club? – Girls in years 4-6.

Average number of children who attend the club each time? – 16.

Who is the club deliverer and what role do they have? – Jenny Palmer (Year 2 Teacher).

How many sessions / weeks does the club run for? – The girls have to sign up for the whole term.

How have you targeted the group? – Two of the girls play netball, the others do not normally attend sports clubs. The children were not specifically targeted to take part in the club, the club's theme and activities attracted the girls to it.

Have you included any other activities? - The girls sing and dance to popular music.

Have you seen a change in the children? – Two of the girls were chosen to attend the Playground Leaders course and they now run KS1 activities in the playground. For non-sporty children to take on this role is exceptional.

Has the club made a difference to you? – The group performed at the opening ceremony (pictured below) of the athletics at the Level 3 School Games in Chester in March 2015. Some of these children are unlikely to experience a Level 3 competition as a competitor, so this was a great opportunity for them.

Is there anything that you would do differently? - The school are considering at some stage in the future of using the C4L promotion materials and following the C4L themes.
