Thursday 22nd June was just the perfect day for the Year 3&4 Mini Red Tennis Competition at Glan Aber Tennis Club; the weather was warm and slightly cloudy with a small breeze.

Eleven school teams took part in the competition which saw 45 children take part in the Level 2 School Games event. The children took part in boys doubles competitions and girls doubles competitions. With the scores then added together to make the team scores for the school.

The competition was split into two pools, the winners and runners up from each pool then took part in the semi-finals. Results are as follows:
